I am a career educator from Gwinnett County who recently retired from the Georgia Department of Education. In my state position I was the Director of Recognition Programs, overseeing the application processes and award banquets/events for Teacher of the Year, Georgia Schools of Excellence, Blue Ribbon Schools, and the Milken Educator Awards as well as managing competitive grant programs.
